What you will need 250g (8Oz) sultanas 250g (8Oz) currants 90g (30z) chopped red glace cherries 1/2 cup sherry or brandy 60g (2oz) self-raising flour <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> teaspoon ground ginger 250g (8oz) butter 1/2 teaspoon lemon essence OR finely grated lemon rind 1/2 teaspoon vanilla essence

250g (8Oz) chopped raisins 125g (4Oz) chopped mixed peel 90g (3oz) chopped blanched almonds 250g (8oz) plain flour <sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> teaspoon grated nutmeg <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> teaspoon ground cloves 250g (8oz) soft brown sugar <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> teaspoon almond essence 4 large eggs



### METHOD:

Mix together all the fruits and nuts and sprinkle with the sherry or brandy. Cover and leave for at least 1 hour, but preferably overnight. Sift together the flours and spices. Cream together the butter and sugar with the essences. Add the eggs one at a time, beating well after each addition, then alternatively add the fruit and flour mixtures. Mix Thoroughly. The mixtures should be stiff enough to support a wooden spoon. Place the mixture into a prepared tin no larger than 20cm (8") and bake in a slow oven for approximately  $3\frac{1}{2}$  - 4 hours. Allow the cake to cool in the tin.

### Notes:

- \* To ensure uniformity and depending on the size, it is suggested that the raisins be snipped into 2-3 pieces, cherries into 4-6 pieces and almonds crosswise into 3-4 pieces.




