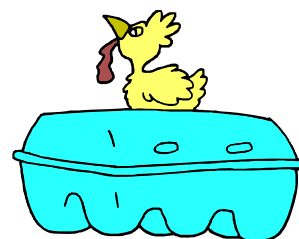

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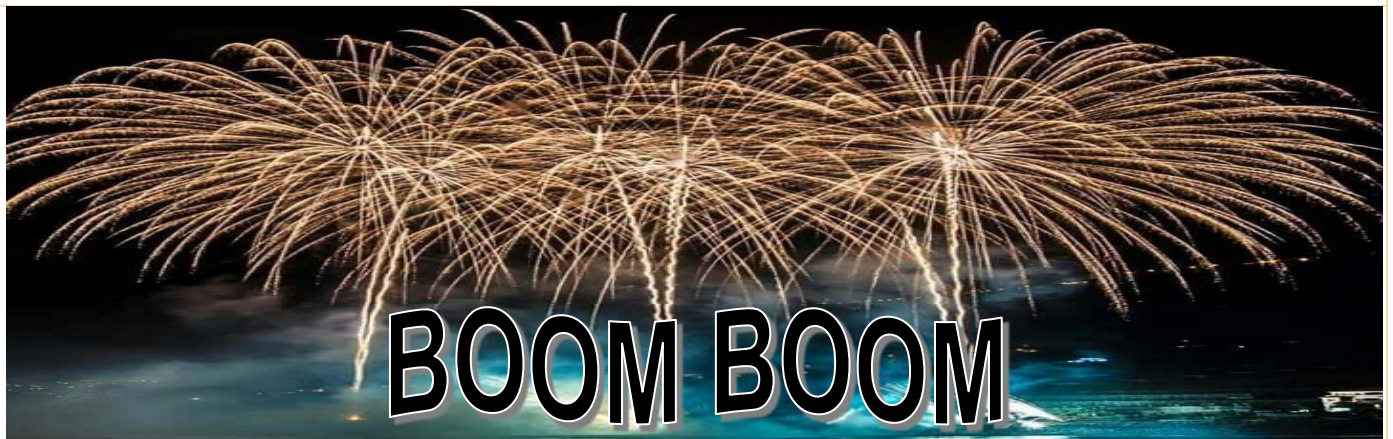

5. All sheep showing odd teeth must be taken as at an advanced age
6. Sheep entered in class for which it is found they are not eligible may be transferred to any other class for which they are eligible
7. The judge shall have the power to disqualify and mark as disqualified any exhibit which in his opinion does not comply with the regulations and shall enter the reason in his book. In the event of any protest or disqualification being upheld, the next award shall not necessarily take the higher prize. The judge shall award or withhold it at his discretion
8. Exhibits shall be in their pens not later than 9am on the day of the Show
9. Sheep may be entered only for one (1) class and under no circumstances will sheep be allowed to be removed from one pen to another except where otherwise mentioned

To be judged on the following scale of points as supplied by the National Council of Wool Selling Brokers of Australia: Trueness to type: 10 points; Uniformity of length: 6 points; Soundness: 6 points; Handle: 6 points; Colour: 6 points; Character: 10 points; Density: 6 points; Evenness: 10 points; Top and Nil: 40 points.

What you will need

250g (8Oz) sultanas
250g (8Oz) currants
90g (3oz) chopped red glace cherries
½ cup sherry or brandy
60g (2oz) self-raising flour
½ teaspoon ground ginger
250g (8oz) butter
½ teaspoon lemon essence
OR finely grated lemon rind
½ teaspoon vanilla essence

250g (8Oz) chopped raisins
125g (4Oz) chopped mixed peel
90g (3oz) chopped blanched almonds
250g (8oz) plain flour
¼ teaspoon grated nutmeg
½ teaspoon ground cloves
250g (8oz) soft brown sugar
½ teaspoon almond essence
4 large eggs



METHOD:

Mix together all the fruits and nuts and sprinkle with the sherry or brandy. Cover and leave for at least 1 hour, but preferably overnight. Sift together the flours and spices. Cream together the butter and sugar with the essences. Add the eggs one at a time, beating well after each addition, then alternatively add the fruit and flour mixtures. Mix Thoroughly. The mixtures should be stiff enough to support a wooden spoon. Place the mixture into a prepared tin no larger than 20cm (8") and bake in a slow oven for approximately 3 ½ - 4 hours. Allow the cake to cool in the tin.

The original of this form is to be attached to the National Vendor Declaration (NVD) form accompanying the cattle, if applicable. A duplicate remains with the vendor; it is recommended the vendor retains a copy of this declaration for seven (7) years.

TREATMENTS & VACCINATIONS

Some manufacturers include more than one of the categories listed in the same vaccine, known as a combination vaccine. If you use a combination vaccine, each agent(s), as appropriate, should be detailed.

Check test – testing of 50 adult animals in the herd (or all eligible animals in a herd if less than 50 adult animals) biased to increase the probability of detecting infection, tested by (pooled) faecal culture or (pooled) HT-J faecal PCR. An ELISA test is available but is not recommended and also not accepted for entry of cattle to WA.

Sample test – screening of the adult herd or a large representative sample of the adult herd by an approved test (pooled) faecal culture or (pooled) HT-J faecal PCR. See note above for ELISA test.

Grazing of non-bovine species – Buyers of cattle from this consignment may consider the grazing of other JD-susceptible species (sheep, goats, alpacas) on the source property as important to their risk-management decisions. These buyers are entitled to seek information on how you have managed disease risks for all your livestock.
