The dog is permitted to jump onto or over the jump

Any mishandling or misuse of a dog will result in an immediate disqualification

If a steward is to determine that a dog is unsafe to other competitors of the general public it will be withdrawn from the competition and asked to leave the grounds.

In the event of two dogs jumping the same height in the grand final jump the dog who took the least attempts to clear the height will be awarded the prize. Should two or more dogs take the same amount of attempts to clear the jump the prize will be split equally amongst the winning competitors

AGRICULTURAL SOCIETIES COUNCIL STATE RICH FRUIT CAKE COMPETITION

THE FOLLOWING RECIPE IS COMPULSORY FOR ALL ENTRANTS

What you will need

250g (8Oz) sultanas	250g (8Oz) chopped raisins		
250g (8Oz) currants	125g (4Oz) chopped mixed peel		
90g (30z) chopped red glace cherries	90g (3oz) chopped blanched almonds		
1/2 cup sherry or brandy	250g (8oz) plain flour		
60g (2oz) self-raising flour	1/4 teaspoon grated nutmeg		
1/2 teaspoon ground ginger	1/2 teaspoon ground cloves		
250g (8oz) butter	250g (8oz) soft brown sugar		
1/2 teaspoon lemon essence	1/2 teaspoon almond essence		
OR finely grated lemon rind	4 large eggs		
1/2 teaspoon vanilla essence			

METHOD:

Mix together all the fruits and nuts and sprinkle with the sherry or brandy. Cover and leave for at least 1 hour, but preferably overnight. Sift together the flours and spices. Cream together the butter and sugar with the essences. Add the eggs one at a time, beating well after each addition, then alternatively add the fruit and flour mixtures. Mix Thoroughly. The mixtures should be stiff enough to support a wooden spoon. Place the mixture into a prepared tin no larger than 20cm (8") and bake in a slow oven for approximately 3 $\frac{1}{2}$ - 4 hours. Allow the cake to cool in the tin.

Notes:

- To ensure uniformity and depending on the size, it is suggested that the raisins be snipped into 2-3 pieces, cherries into 4-6 pieces and almonds crosswise into 3-4 pieces.
- Prize money is sponsored by the Agricultural Societies Council
- Winners at country shows will receive a cash prize of \$20 and will be required to bake a second "Rich Fruit Cake" in order to compete in a semi-final to be conducted by each of the fourteen Groups of the Agricultural Societies Council of NSW.
- The fourteen winners at regional level will each receive a cash prize of \$20, and are required to bake a third "Rich Fruit Cake" for final judging at the Royal Easter Show, where the winners will receive a cash prize of \$50.
- Competitors may only represent one Show Society in a Group Final or State Final.
